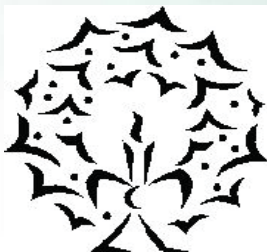

Nominations and Election Matters

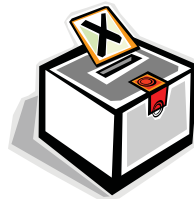
HBEA is accepting nominations for officer positions for the 2007-2008 fiscal year. Any member who has served at least one year on the HBEA Executive Board and Council should consider running for an officer position. If you are interested in running or nominating someone for a position, please contact Della Kunimune at kunimune@hawaii.edu or 455-0347 by December 15, 2006.

President-Elect: The President-Elect shall succeed to the office of President at the expiration of the President's term of office. The President-Elect shall prepare a proposed budget for his/her term as President and present the budget to the Executive Board at the transition meeting prior to assuming the Presidency. The President-Elect shall assume other duties that the President or Executive Board may delegate or assign.

Vice-President: The Vice-President shall assist the President in preparing the calendar and planning the program for the year. The Vice-President shall coordinate the activities of the various committees and assist the President and President-Elect. The Vice-President will serve as the current year's State Conference Committee Chair. The Vice-President shall assume other duties that the President and

Executive Board may delegate or assign.

Secretary: The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all the meetings of the Executive Board, timely distribute a copy of the minutes and agendas to each of the Executive Board members, and archive/destroy records according to the HBEA retention schedule.



Treasurer: The Treasurer shall receive and disburse the funds using a checking account in the name of the Association. The Treasurer may keep a \$50.00 petty-cash fund for payments and purchases of items less than \$10.00.

The Treasurer shall submit a report of the receipts and the expenditures and balance on hand at each meeting and/or request of the President. . The Treasurer shall assist the President-Elect in preparing a statement of the proposed annual budget.

Voting: Voting members may vote at the annual State Conference. Any voting member wishing to submit an absentee ballot must submit a request by Midnight on December 31, 2006. An absentee ballot may be requested by contacting Della Kunimune. Completed absentee ballots must be submitted or postmarked by Saturday, January 13, 2007.

Sharing Space

Tips for teaching, learning, and living

Is your school having a problem with the U3 flash drives? We know of at least two schools that ran into difficulty with students using U3 flash drives on networks. Kay Ono at Leeward Community College shared this tip. In brief, they uninstalled the U3 installation program and then reformatted the flash drive. Once that

was done, they removed the flash drive and reinserted it to save as a "regular" flash drive.

Kay consulted the Geek Squad who recommended the following: Upload the Geek Squad U3 removal utility. The file is in a rar encryption format. You will need a compression utility to extract the executable file. If you do not have one, you can download WinRAR from the following site: <http://www.rarlab.com/download.htm>.

Here is the location to download the U3 Uninstaller.

Simply download the U3_Uninstaller.rar file and extract it to any convenient location. Insert the USB drive that you want to remove U3, then execute the U3_Uninstaller.exe file you extracted in the previous step. Follow the on-screen steps to finish the removal.

Edamame Rice

Here's a recipe that carnivores, vegetarians, and vegans can enjoy.

4-1/2 cups raw rice
1 bag (16 ounces) shelled, frozen edamame (soybeans)
1 bottle (7.05 ounces) Shirakiku nametake (Japanese seasoned mushrooms)
1 bottle (1.7 to 1.8 ounces) ochazuke wakame (Japanese rice seasoning)

- (1) Cook rice.
- (2) About 10 minutes before rice is done, cook edamame according to package directions, but do not chill in iced water.
- (3) Place cooked rice in large bowl.
- (4) Add edamame, nametake and ochazuke wakame; toss to combine. Serve warm or at room temperature. Serves 10.

This recipe was found in the March 15, 2006, issue of the *Honolulu Star-Bulletin*.

Variations:

Use brown rice instead of white rice and furikake instead of ochazuke wakame. Serve with seasoned nori (might slow the buffet line.) Cut rice

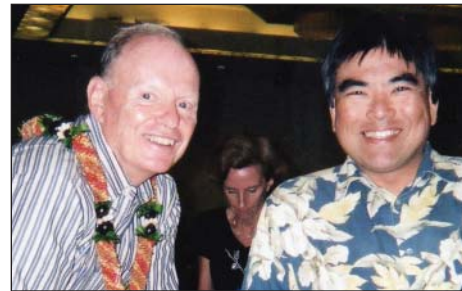
